When challenged by a professor to find ways to improve life in Winnipeg, Taylor Boucher knew what she wanted to do: help people stay warm in winter.

The 27-year-old North Kildonan resident takes transit to classes at the University of Winnipeg, waiting for the bus at McIvor Loop in the northeast corner of the city.

"Waiting for a bus in winter is cold," she said, noting it made her think of other commuters and homeless people who might not have tuques, mitts and scarves to stay warm.


What's New for 2023

Over the years, the **Multifaith Calendar** has been privileged to feature aboriginal seasons and moons according to different **First Nations**, including **Nisga'a** (northwestern BC) and **Ojibwa** (eastern BC to western Quebec and in the upper and mid-west in the US), and **Cree** (across western and central Canada and Quebec as well as in Montana). This year, the **2023 Multifaith Calendar** features moons and months as observed by the Coast Salish First Nations.

The **2023 Multifaith Calendar** once again features moons and

months according to the **Coast Salish First Nations**. The Coast Salish is a group of ethnically and linguistically related indigenous peoples of the Pacific Northwest Coast, living in British Columbia, Canada and the US states of Washington and Oregon. They are part of the Indigenous Peoples of the Pacific Northwest Coast and speak one of the Salishan languages.

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
