What's New for 2024:

Over the years, the Multifaith Calendar has been privileged to feature aboriginal
seasons and moons according to different First Nations, including Nisga'a
(northwestern BC) and Ojibwa (eastern BC to western Quebec and in the upper
and mid-west in the US), Cree (across western and central Canada and Quebec as
well as in Montana), and Coast Salish (Pacific Northwest).

This year, the 2024 Multifaith Calendar features moons and months as observed
by the Mi'kmaq First Nations.

The Mi'kmaq are a First Nation of Indigenous people whose territory—called
Mi'kma'ki—spans the maritime provinces of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince
Edward Island, and parts of Newfoundland and Quebec. The Mi'kmaq have lived
there for 11,000 years and their language is one of the Eastern Algonquian family
of languages. The Mi'kmaw Moons names denote the passage of time by reflecting
activities in the natural world through the seasons.

Reflections on 2023

As the end of the year is fast approaching, I thought it would be good to recap some of the work IHCAM has done for its membership and the community to demonstrate that we are there to support and advocate for you.

CLINICAL PASTORAL EDUCATION

For well over ten years now IHCAM has been committed to the CPE certification program. For several years we financed supervisors to deliver CPE units, and for the last two years have contributed \$20,000 towards the program at Selkirk Mental Health Centre. 2024 will be the last \$10,000 contribution to support SMHC.

Through its **Member Education Fund**, IHCAM provided support for four students towards their CPE tuitions. We firmly believe in this program and want to ensure that individuals who are striving to enhance their capacity to provide spiritual health services in our health sector are assisted.

IHCAM also supported twenty-two (22) other members to attend faith-based conferences such as the Canadian Association of Spiritual Care and the Global Leadership Network's spring and fall conferences.

WORKSHOPS AND CONFERENCES ORGANIZED BY IHCAM

Kairos Blanket Exercise: This was held in January to help additional people garner a better understanding on Turtle Island's history and the impact that colonization and Residential Schools have had on Indigenous people.

Caring for the Human Spirit Conference in April 2023 IHCAM participates in this annual conference organized by the Healthcare Chaplaincy Network and invites SHPs to participate in it virtually as well.

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Overcoming Barriers to Spiritual Health:

A grand rounds with Dr. Koenig attracted 68 people on November 10th.
