John Longhurst

In columns and reporting for the *Winnipeg Free Press* over two decades, journalist **John Longhurst** has covered faith from a multitude of perspectives. *Can Robots Love God and Be Saved? A Journalist Reports*

Longhurst is perennially curious about religious faith in its various expressions. Whether writing about Holocaust survivors, residential schools, religious relics, interreligious misunderstandings, assisted dying, or how women religious leaders are treated, **John Longhurst** has something thought-provoking to say about the way faith touches all aspects of our lives.



John Longhurst has carved out an impressive career in journalism, media relations, and marketing & communications (especially from a non-profit perspective), working for organizations such as Canadian Foodgrains Bank, Mennonite Central Committee, and Mennonite Disaster Services. Longhurst organized **Canada's first major conference on faith and the media** in Ottawa in 1998, and in 2021 received the **Lieutenant Governor's Award for the Advancement of Interreligious Understanding in Manitoba**. His book *Making the News: An Essential Guide to Effective Media Relations* was published in 2006. He has written over 900 columns and over 600 articles about faith for the *Winnipeg Free Press* over the past two decades and continues to cover the faith beat for the *Free Press* and many other publications.

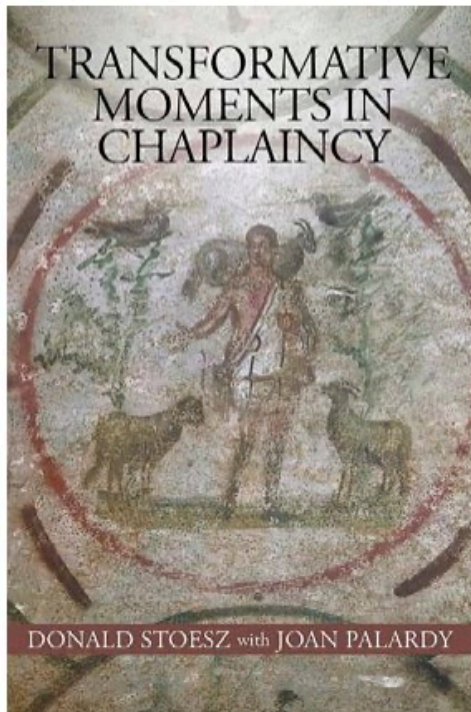
